Students will use manipulatives to represent their thinking, while engaging in a variety of Number Routines to demonstrate their understanding of the task at hand, applying specific strategies that will intentionally improve their conceptual understanding and computational fluency. Student thinking will deepen and broaden as they make connections across strands.
