Let's keep working together to improve literacy! We have renewed our subscriptions for all Kindergarten to Grade 3 students to have the opportunity to develop their literacy skills through an online reading program called RAZ Kids. This program features hundreds of interactive, leveled eBooks for your child to read on your home computer, tablet or mobile device. Please contact your child's teacher for usernames and passwords.

With each book, there are three steps:

- First, the book can be read aloud to you and your child by the program. This gives your child a chance to listen to the text, familiarize themselves with unfamiliar vocabulary and build their confidence as they get ready to read it independently.
- Second, once your child is ready, they can independently read the book aloud, and record their voice as they read it. After recording, children love hearing their recorded voices read the book back to them, which is motivating and gives them yet another opportunity to practice the book. After your child has finished recording their voice reading the book independently, they also have the option of sending that recording to their teacher.
- Finally, there is a comprehension quiz that tests your child's understanding of the text.

If you are unsure of the correct level (just right book) please contact your child's teacher. Once they have chosen a book, go through the three steps above. Reading a handful of levelled books each week will make a huge difference in your child's reading.

Switching To Or From Our Virtual Schools

Virtual School Transfers

Here's information you need to know if you are planning to transfer your child or teen between virtual and in-person learning.

Virtual Elementary School (VES)

- To move your child from in-person classes to VES, please complete the opt-in portal at https://optin.kprdsb.ca/ between November 12 and noon on November 19.
- VES teachers will contact new VES families during the week of November 22. New classes will begin November 29.

Return to Bricks and Mortar Timelines:

Families wishing to return to bricks and mortar are required to contact the home school. Home schools are free to accept students back at any time as they make space available. All transitions should be completed **by November 29**th at the latest.

Important Reminders

Please send your child with adequate food for lunches and breaks and all required items. Also please be sure to include extra forks and spoons in plastic baggies in your child's backpack so that they do not need to leave the class and ask for one at the office. All students will need a water bottle. Water fountains will be closed, but water filling stations are available. Our supply of water bottles is almost empty. We would greatly appreciate your assisting in reminding your older children to bring their own bottles for refilling.

Entry to School

Please remember, if you have a reason to arrive at the school outside of entry/dismissal times, you are to ring the buzzer at the front door. We can only communicate with you via the intercom system. You will need to state your name and the reason you are present (bringing in child late, signing out for appt., etc.) and your child will be sent out to you, or you will be asked to send your child in on their own. We have one secretary. Patience and kindness would be appreciated if your call is not answered immediately. Do keep in mind that if you arrive between 8:50-9:00 a.m. we are likely in the middle of O Canada and announcements, so the door will not be answered immediately. Sometimes we are also on the phone and cannot speak to two parties at the same time. The buzzer is quite loud on the inside of the school so there is no need to repeatedly press it. If after a few minutes you are not acknowledged, please call the school 905-433-8747. Parents/guardians are not permitted in the building without an appointment. There will be no exceptions. Thank you for your understanding of these present circumstances.

Kiss and Ride

Please be reminded to let students out of the vehicle on the right-hand side of the car. **Avoid getting out on the left-hand side**, **as this is into moving traffic and dangerous.** Please pull up as far as you can for drop off so that others behind you may pull up efficiently. Thank you for driving carefully as you go through the Kiss and Ride. No one should be speeding through this high traffic area.

Additional COVID Resources

It is critical to screen ourselves every morning for possible symptoms of COVID-19. Students and staff who feel unwell should remain at home, even if their symptoms seem as minor as a mild cold.

Our primary tool for communication between parents and teachers will be EDSBY. Invitations will be sent from time to time to your email, if you have not yet activated your account. Bookmark the parent portal from the Board website for ease of access. https://parents.kprdsb.ca/. If you have difficulties logging in, please email Edsby support at support@edsby.com

Otherwise you can follow the below steps to help troubleshoot Edsby login issues for parent accounts:

- 1. Attempt to reset your Edsby account password
- Go to kpr.edsby.com and select Forgot Password:



- If you receive any message that indicates that you cannot reset your password, please proceed to step 2. If you can reset your password, please follow the prompts to do so and disregard the remainder of this message.
- 2. Please search for an Edsby invitation email from <u>noreply@kpr.edsby.com</u>. Ensure you are using the email address that you have registered with the school. If you can locate an Edsby invitation email, please proceed to step 3.
 - If you are unable to find the email, please let your school office staff know and disregard the remainder of this message.
- 3. Once you have located the email, please open the link in the email to activate a new Edsby account, illustrated in the image below.

4. Once the link opens choose the second option to create an Edsby account.



From The Board

Indigenous Peoples Awareness Month

In February, 2017, the Board was pleased to adopt a recommendation from its Indigenous Education Advisory Committee to recognize November as Indigenous Peoples Awareness Month each year. November was chosen as it includes Treaty Recognition Week, Louis Riel Day and Inuit Day.

"As a Board, we have identified the need to champion Indigenous education, achievement and awareness as a key commitment for our schools and within our organization as a whole. We are very proud for this work to continue within our schools to strengthen our understanding of Indigenous culture and history. We are gratified that our students and staff are so passionate about embracing this learning throughout the year," says Diane Lloyd, Chairperson of the Board.

"As educators we want to ensure ALL students and staff continue their journey in understanding and awareness of Indigenous cultures, ways of knowing, and contributions to society as part of their educational experience," says Rita Russo, Director of Education. "We are a learning organization, and it's our work to continue to create environments that honour Indigenous knowledge, culture, perspective and history and ensure Indigenous students, staff and community see themselves reflected in their learning and working environments."

Culturally Relevant and Responsive Pedagogy: School Toolkit

As part of the Equity, Diversity and Inclusion and Program Review Committee reports, Trustees reviewed plans to support the Ministry of Education's Equity Action Plan to identify and eliminate persistent inequities in education. This action plan identified a key aspect to removing barriers is to ensure that school and classroom practices reflect and respond to the diversity of students and staff. It was stated that existing structures, policies, programs, and practices may unintentionally disadvantage certain student populations, including racialized students, students experiencing poverty, Indigenous students, newcomers to Canada, students who identify as LGBTQ2S+, children and youth in care, religious minorities, French language minorities, students with disabilities, and students with special education needs.

To support these goals, board staff have created a Culturally Relevant and Responsive Pedagogy (CRRP) Toolkit to provide schools and educators with ideas, tools, and strategies to create learning environments that promote cultural identity, inclusive pedagogy, and proportional outcomes for all students.

"We need to ensure all students feel a sense of belonging at school," says Rita Russo, Director of Education. "One path to making that happen is to ensure our teaching and assessment content and practices allow students to see themselves in their learning. We want the cultural identities and experiences of our students to be a part of their daily experience in the classroom."

As part of the launch of the toolkit, professional learning was provided for all elementary and secondary educators in June and September, including an introduction to anti-racism and anti-oppression. Professional learning will be ongoing throughout the year to principals, equity leaders, and educators in these areas and other, and monthly activities and resources will be added to the toolkit throughout the year.

Menstrual Equity

KPR is pleased to proceed with the Menstrual Equity (ME) program in participating schools over the coming weeks. In the first year of a two-year plan, all secondary schools and 36 pilot elementary schools will receive tampons and pads that students can access for free in at least one girls' washroom and one all-gender washroom.

The ultimate goal of the ME program, championed by Student Trustees, is to be more inclusive of all individuals who menstruate, including those who identify as trans, gender non-binary or gender-fluid. ME also aims to ensure all students can participate fully in school, regardless of socio-economic status and ability to afford menstrual products.

The province-wide free menstrual product program recently announced by the Ministry of Education will help to support the Menstrual Equity program approved by KPR Trustees last spring.

Information for Families

At the Kawartha Pine Ridge District School Board, we inspire our students to excel in learning, to succeed in life, and to enrich our communities. We appreciate the support of parents/guardians and community members to help us achieve this goal. We are very fortunate to receive donations to our schools and programs from parents/guardians and community members. We wanted to let you know that we now have the ability to accept donations online for our schools and fundraising initiatives.

If at any time you are interested in making a donation to a particular school, please visit School Cash Online, at https://kprdsb.schoolcashonline.com/. Donors will automatically receive tax receipts through email for donations \$1 and over.

What qualifies as a donation?

Donations must meet the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) criteria for a tax receipt:

- there is no benefit to the donor,
- the directed gift does not benefit any person not dealing at arm's length with the donor, and
- decisions about how the donations will be used will be made by the charity (in this case the school).

What does not qualify as a donation?

Examples of payments which do not qualify as donations (no tax receipt provided) and which should not be made through the online donation module include (but are not limited to):

- donations to external charities (i.e. Terry Fox Run) payment for a table at a fun fair to sell parent crafts, and
- donations where the donor has requested that the gift be used for a specific purpose or person(s).


